Legion III Cyrenaica is a Roman living history organization with membership throughout the New England region. The group researches, reconstructs, and presents this historical Legion as it may have appeared in Egypt and later in Syria during the Roman Empire (covering 40–400 CE). The Legion functioned primarily as military police, based outside Alexandria and manning road stations and watchtowers along the trade roads in the Koptos region.

While the main focus of the group is on the arms, armor, and military functions of the Roman Legion, the group also features non-citizen Auxiliary and nonmilitary/civilian aspects.

Local History

The Book Express

Public libraries have long employed a variety of ways to get books into the hands of patrons, ranging from, in the early days, physically setting aside requested titles at the "Check-out" Desk to hand delivering books to local nursing homes to today's promotions of new titles on Facebook and Instagram. What many of us may not know is that meeting patrons' needs has always been directed toward **everyone**, including children younger than 13 years old* and adults who for one reason or another, whether temporarily or not, can't leave their homes. Furthermore, crises like the COVID-19 pandemic have presented particular challenges and prompted unique solutions to making certain that all patrons have access to the materials they not only want, but also need to help them navigate, stay informed, and endure.

This year the Library is celebrating the **25th anniversary** of what is known as "**The Book Express.**" This program, a pleasant and polished outreach service that helps place Library materials into the hands of patrons who are homebound, whatever the reason or duration, grew out of the different methods of delivery and retrieval mentioned above. Overseen today by Assistant Circulation Manager Danielle Yanco, the Express requests that patrons complete an application in which they can note both the format(s) and type(s) of media they prefer, their favorite authors and magazines, and any other "reading or listening needs" they may have. Program participants also enjoy the following benefits:

- Having a librarian make their selections, based on their application and lists of specific titles, if desired;
- Making selections whenever they're ready, rather than according to a set schedule;
- Having a librarian record checked-out materials for their future use;
- · Enjoying materials for a full six weeks; and
- Frequently receiving a friendly note from staff in their bag of selections.

Volunteers at the Gale Free originally delivered selections to our homebound patrons, but today the Holden Senior Center provides pick-up, drop-off, and return services. Participants also have the option of designating an individual who will pick up and return items for them.

Please join us in celebrating this beneficial and much-appreciated service of the Gale Free Library. May "The Book Express" continue to make a meaningful difference in the lives of our patrons who cannot always make their way to us for many years to come.

*Books for "juveniles" ("children") were available from the day the Library opened its doors in 1888, but these titles had to be checked out and brought home by responsible adults. The most likely reason? The cultural precept "Children should be seen and not heard."
