The Girl with the Ponytail: A Cubist Reinterpretation by Nile Drochak FEBRUARY 2025 IN THE PROGRAM ROOM








By creating a series of works that draw upon traditional artistic practices such as portraits painted realistically and still life paintings, this exhibition aims to reimagine the possibilities of cubism. Inspired by Picasso's iconic muse, The Girl with the Ponytail, Nile draws upon the rich tradition of realist portraiture and still lives.

In contrast, another series of works explores the innovative language of cubism, a movement pioneered by Picasso himself. While early cubist paintings often focused on a single subject from multiple perspectives, Nile has expanded upon this concept by incorporating multiple subjects into a single composition.
