Library News

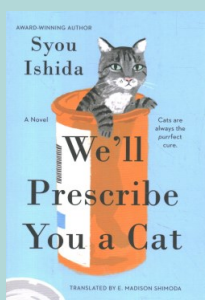
- The Library will close at 4pm on Wednesday, December 31 and remain closed Thursday, January 1 for New Year's Day.

- "The Bookmark" has been refreshed to reflect the new look of our website. If you haven't done so yet, be sure to check out our website at galefreelibrary.org.



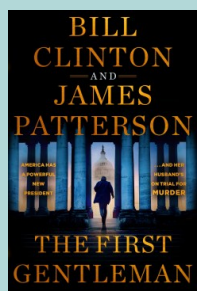

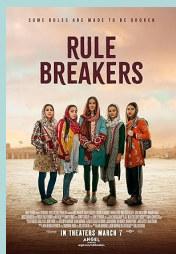

Art Club Wednesday, 1/28 6-7:30pm Ages 16+

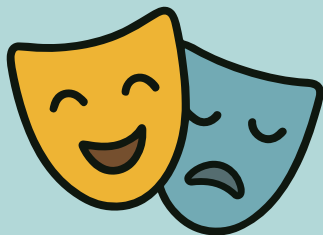

Museum Passes



Of Light and Air:
Winslow Homer in Watercolor
Museum of Fine Arts,
Boston
Through January 19

The Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, houses the largest collection of Winslow Homer's watercolors in the world. The works' fragility and sensitivity to light means they have not been displayed together in nearly half a century.

This exhibition brings dozens of the MFA's Homer watercolors back into the galleries for a new generation to experience, alongside a selection of related oils, drawings, and prints by the artist.

With material ranging from Homer's childhood drawings all the way to his final canvas, left unfinished at the time of his death, visitors can follow the major chapters in his career and learn about the various environments—ecological, artistic, social, and economic—that shaped his enduring work in watercolor.

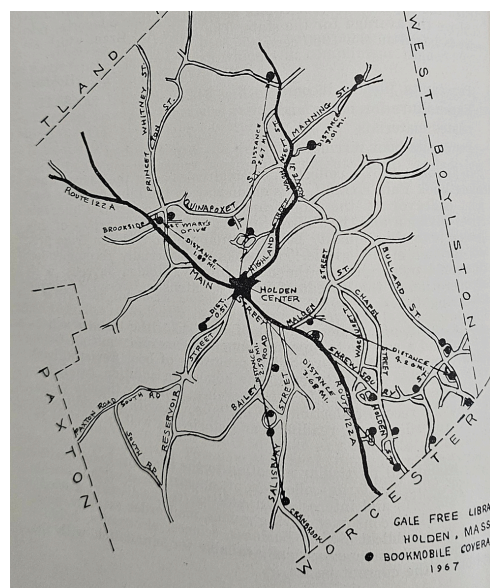
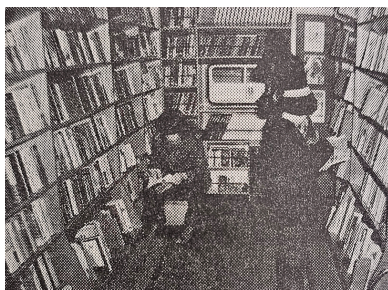

The Bookmobile

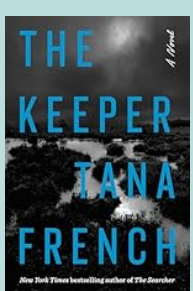
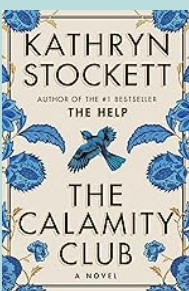
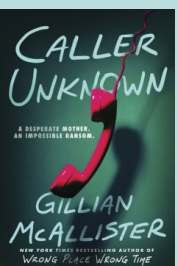
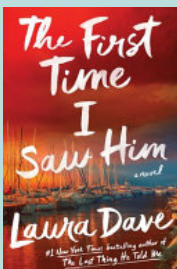
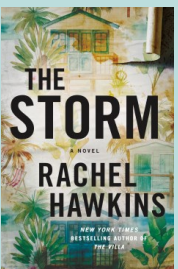
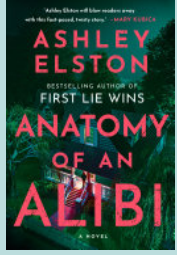
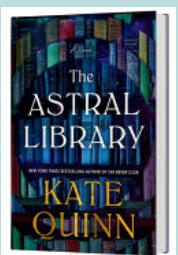
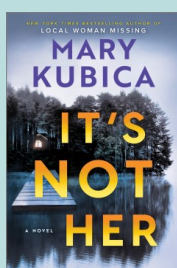
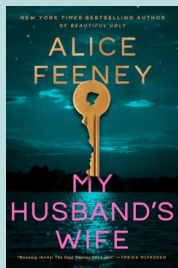
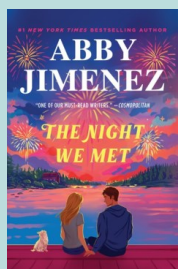
For more than 20 years, the community of Holden enjoyed the advantages of a bookmobile, a vehicle that brought books to patrons. As one of Head Librarian Helen Harding's many achievements, the Gale Free Library's year-around bookmobile service began in 1965, with the bookmobile operating two days a week for a total of eight hours. By 1968, the vehicle was active four afternoons, or 18 hours, a week during cold weather and 22 hours a week during the summer. Stops included not only neighborhoods, but also the residences of the homebound and the Holden Nursing Center. Eventually, Checkerberry Village, Colony Homes, and Holden Junior High* were added. The first vehicle the Library obtained for their bookmobile was a "secondhand" utility truck; it was replaced within four years with a converted 1969 Ford F500 truck. The first driver was Marian MacGregor, a member of the Library staff and the first woman in Massachusetts to obtain the driver's license required to operate such a vehicle! By 1983, the Bookmobile was making 26 stops during the cold months and 47 in summer. Use of the vehicle ended sometime after 1986 (no exact date has been found) when planning for and construction of the addition to the Damon Memorial were under way. With the coming of a main entry without steps and an elevator, the Library would no longer need to provide book delivery on such a large scale.

*The Junior High was added to the schedule temporarily after a fire in 1980 led to the need for a new school building.

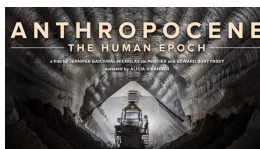
